Dear Mother Nature:
 How do you tell the difference between deer, elk and moose tracks?

Deer only have two toes on each foot. These form their hooves, each toe making a half of a hoof. The Elk and Moose tracks are very similar to the deer except much larger. Elk tracks usually have more rounded toes than the Moose. Let's look at some different tracks.

Take a Track Home

You will need:

- 2 cups water
- 4 cups plaster of paris
- A bowl
- A stick or spoon
- Small paintbrush



1. Outside, take all the materials and look for animal tracks
2. When you find a track, pour the water into the bowl
3. Mix in the plaster of paris and stir until smooth & creamy
4. Pour the mix into the track
5. Wait about 20 minutes until the plaster hardens
6. Lift the plaster cast carefully, brush off dirt with paintbrush
7. Try to identify the animal track
